Did you know that insects need certain trees to survive? See the list below for a few common trees and the species that rely on them for food:

Oak: Cecropia Moth, Luna Moth, Promethea Moth (over 500 moths and butterflies rely on the oak tree!)

River Birch: Virginia Tiger Moth, Fourhorned Sphinx Moth, Small-eyed Sphinx Moth (over 400 moths and butterflies rely on the Birch tree!)



These mating Promethea Moths rely on the Oak Tree. (What do they look like to predators?)

Maple: Giant Leopard Moth (over 200 moths and butterflies rely on the maple tree!)

American Elm: Question Mark Butterfly, Eastern Comma Butterfly, Mourning Cloak Butterfly, Promethea Moth (over 200 moths and butterflies rely on the Elm tree!)

Do you see any birds or wildlife in them?
